Their expertise ranges from counterterrorism to intelligence, from military, legal (criminal and civil), historical, tactical and policy perspectives, to issues of extremism within K-12 schools, colleges and universities.

They are long-term practitioners in their specialties who have conducted training for over 10,000 law enforcement, military and analytical personnel at local, state, federal and corporate levels, and for the private sector, nationwide. CFNS's leaders have testified before congressional committees and regularly appear on national media. They are extensively quoted in the press and have published widely.

## **CFNS on Capitol Hill!**

On July 25th, 2011, over 100 people crowded into a Capitol Hill room in the Rayburn House Office Building to hear CFNS co-Founder Dr. Peter Leitner reveal the first report of its kind about the fifty-year infiltration of the Muslim Brotherhood into the United States. As a result, CFNS walked onto the national stage and became instantly recognized as a leading American citizen's organization in the battle against Islamist terrorism! Congressman Allen West (R-FL), who sponsored the briefing, introduced the program with praise and unequivocal support for CFNS. In the audience were reporters and cameramen from the mainstream news media as well as more than ten different online news sites, senior staff from over two dozen members of the House and Senate, officials from the Department of Homeland Security and the military, and representatives from a wide

## **CFNS – the National Leader in Eliminating Islam-biased School Textbooks**

On August 10, 2011 CFNS filed a lawsuit against the Florida Department of Education (FDOE), the State of Florida and its Governor, to repeal an ethically questionable last-minute change in the State law excluding private citizens from the process of selecting Florida's K-12 public school textbooks.

CFNS made the decision to take this step following its 14-month research into Florida school books that enhance Islam while demeaning Christianity and Judaism. We had identified more than 80 textbooks that contained Islam-biased passages – many used in Florida – among our compiled list of 1,000 texts used in 67 school districts. As the lead organization in Florida on this very important issue, our associated statewide Textbook Action Teams then mounted a huge campaign to include lay citizens in the textbook adoption process mandated by the existing law.

Seeing our commitment to this issue, and fearing our activism, the FDOE on May 6, 2011, secretly and stealthily had the law changed to exclude us – and any outsider citizens – from the adoption procedure. Three reviewers, handpicked by the Commissioner of Education, will now choose the textbooks, totally disenfranchising Florida citizens from having any say in the selection of their children's school books!

## DOCUMENTATION

CFNS provides members with frequent CD's, e-mails and hard copy of reports and publications that primarily reside in the realm of "Gray Literature" – information not classified, but generally unknown and very difficult to find. Typically, such material focuses on a variety of areas, such as: terrorism, insurgency, information warfare, academic infiltration, cultural & legal issues, tactics, weapons, espionage, money laundering, weapons of mass destruction and disruption.

## SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS

## TASK FORCES

CFNS organizes task forces to focus on, or support, the academic community, Congress, the media, and other establishments and professionals where intelligence and national security issues are in play. These task forces work in teams drawn from CFNS's citizen members who choose to become active in combating specific dangers posed by radical Islam and other extremist ideologies. They are educated and enabled to undertake research projects which promise to offer enormous resources for individuals and organizations on the ground working daily to resist the threats to our country from militant Islam.

Our ultimate objective is to become the paramount repository of universally available credible, factual and irrefutable data on key components of the radical Islamist movement. Once we compile this treasure-trove of persuasive evidence, we offer it to those who need it most: prosecutors, law enforcement officials, media reporters, judges, congressional staffs, college professors, government at all levels, think tanks, public school administrators – the list is endless!

### **Examples:**

Identify and detail the organizational structure of the Muslim Brotherhood, and its offshoots, in North America

Catalog all known lawsuits initiated, or threatened, by the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR)

Determine the extent of Islamic influence on K-12 public and private school programs

## SPEAKER TRAINING

CFNS members who have a desire to address civic and other community groups about national security issues receive instruction on substance and style from experienced presenters who possess in-depth knowledge of those subjects. Small classes meet for a series of informal and interactive sessions, in addition to simultaneously reading a few recommended books. In the final phase of the training, participants engage in speaker/audience role-playing based upon presentations created, delivered and critiqued by their classmates. CFNS then assigns them to speaking engagements.



## PRINCIPAL ORGANIZERS

**Dr. William A. Saxton**, educated and trained at both MIT (S.M.) and Harvard University (Ph.D.), has had extensive involvement in the United States Department of Defense and intelligence arenas. He has been a NASA consultant, headed research projects under assignment to the US Army, participated in programs related to strategic cooperation between the US and Middle East countries, and worked in the intelligence community. Among his other achievements in the Middle East, he conceived and directed a program to bring cadets and midshipmen from US military academies to Israel to learn about the region and meet their counterparts. Dr. Saxton also has broad experience in coordinating and operating seminars and conferences on both regional and national levels. He created the first-ever computer/IT conference for Federal government, the first Federal Office Automation Conference; and, most recently, founded and chaired the highly successful National Intelligence Conference (INTELCON) that was held in Washington, DC in 2005 and 2006.



**Dr. Peter Leitner**, whose 31 year government career includes 19 years in the Office of the Secretary of Defense as senior strategic trade advisor, has provided intelligence and anti-terrorism training to thousands of state and local investigators, law enforcement personnel, the CIA, FBI, Marine Corps and other national agencies through the Higgins Counterterrorism Research Center which he founded. Dr. Leitner, who holds a Ph.D. from USC, and four Master degrees, has served on the faculties of University of Northern Virginia, Mount Vernon College, Southeastern University, and George Mason University in its National Center for Biodefense; and, been a Senior Fellow with George Washington University's Center for Advanced Defense Studies, and Advisor on Terrorism with New York University's Law School. He is President of the Washington Center for Peace and Justice, and a member of the Center for Security Policy's Military Advisory Committee.
